Moreover, she considers questions about the relation between the personal and the political, what it is to be a woman, whether there is a distinctive kind of women's knowledge, and what feminist philosophy can bring to our understanding of such aspects of our world as justice, work, and the environment. This *Very Short Introduction* takes a richly intersectional approach, recognizing the combined impact of such factors as race and class as well as gender.
